## The Beginnning

IIT Gandhinagar was formally inaugurated on August 2, 2008 with its first batch of 90 B Tech students from Chemical, Electrical and Mechanical Engineering streams. The event was marked by the presence of Prof Ashok Misra, Director, IITB/IITGN together with Prof A K Singh, Convener IITGN Cell at IITB, Prof U A Yajnik, Dean Academic Programme and Student Affairs, IITGN, Prof S Biswas, Dean Academic Programme, IITB, Prof R K Shevgaonkar, Dean Resource Management, IITB. Among the other dignitaries present on the occasion were Shri P Panneervel, Principal Secretary Revenue, Smt Anita Karwal, Principal Secretary Education, Shri Manish Bhardwaj, Director Technical Education of the Govt of Gujarat and Prof Kartic Khillar, Director, PDPU, Gandhinagar.

Major General (Retd) Vijay Aga was the first to arrive at Ahmedabad on July 7, 2008 to start IIT Gandhinagar and ensured the timely creation of infrastructure to get the Institute going. He was followed by Prof Urjit A Yajnik who moved from IITB to IITGN as Dean of Student Affairs and Academic Programmes on July 23, 2008.

## **Professor Sudhir K Jain at the helm**



Professor Sudhir Kumar Jain joined as the first Director of IITGN on June 4, 2009. Prof Jain received his Bachelor of Engineering (Civil) from University of Roorkee in 1979, the Master of Science from California Institute of Technology (Caltech), Pasadena, USA in 1980, and the Doctor of Philosophy, also from Caltech, in 1983. He joined Civil Engineering faculty at IIT Kanpur in 1984 and in June 2009 moved over to IIT Gandhinagar as its Director.

Professor Jain is an active researcher in earthquake engineering. He has carried out important studies after all the major earthquakes in India since 1988. He has been instrumental in improving state-of-the-practice in the construction industry in India, through development of Indian seismic codes and commentaries, and extremely popular continuing education courses for professional engineers. Professor Jain serves on the Board of Directors of the International Association for Earthquake Engineering and is currently its Executive Vice President. He is on the Board of Directors of the World Seismic Safety Initiative, an organization that promotes earthquake risk reduction in developing countries. Professor Jain was elected a Fellow of the Indian National Academy of Engineering in 2003.

## **Campus and Facilities**

IIT Gandhinagar is temporarily housed within the campus of Vishwakarma Govt Engg College (VGEC), Chandkheda, in Ahmedabad. An academic infrastructure comprising classrooms, laboratories, faculty offices, library, medical facilities, etc., exclusively for the use of IIT Gandhinagar students and faculty has been established in this campus. Student hostels have been created in the multistory residential buildings across the street from the campus. The living conditions at IIT Gandhinagar are of the highest quality, emphasizing the well being of the students through a good mix of academic rigour and sporting activities.
