



Initiatives," said Javadekar.

He said the government is working for "brain gain" by providing incentives to Indians studying and working abroad. He added that Rs 30,000 crore has been earmarked for upgrading and establishing research labs across India. He added that foreign-educated youths are returning home to support India's growth.

Citing the example of an IIT-Gandhinagar professor, the minister said that subjects such as mathematics should be taught in interesting manner. "It doesn't need much equipment, but simple ideas. We have initiated IMPRINT scholarships and ATAL tinkering labs to encourage talent," said Javadekar.
